

1. **Rocky Marciano** (September 1, 1923 - August 31, 1969) Born Rocco F. Marchegiano. The heavyweight champion of the world, 1952 to 1956.
2. **Romaldo "Aldo" Giurgola** (September 1, 1920 -) Architect, professor and author.
3. **Neil Denari** (September 03, 1957 -) American architect, professor, and author.
4. **Anthony J. Celebrezze Sr.** (September 4, 1910 - October 29, 1998) Cleveland, OH Mayor, Cabinet member, and U.S. Appeals Court Judge.
5. **Jack Joseph Valenti** (September 5, 1921 - April 26, 2007) President of the Motion Picture Association of America.
6. **Vincent DiMaggio** (September 6, 1912 - October 3, 1986) Played baseball for the Giants, Phils, Keds, and Braves.
7. **Adriano Panatta** (July 9, 1950 -) Italian tennis star who is best known for winning the French Open in 1976.
8. **Ludovico Ariosto** (September 8, 1474 - July 6, 1533) Italian Poet.
9. **Luigi Galvani** (September 9, 1737 - December 4, 1798) Italian physician and physicist; discovered muscle and nerve cells produce electricity.
10. **Niccolò Jommelli** (September 10, 1714 - August 25, 1774) Italian composer.
11. **Rudolph Giuliani** (September 11, 1944 -) A lawyer and businessman who served as the Mayor of New York City from 1994-2001.
12. **Reginald B. Desiderio** (September 12, 1918 - November 27, 1950) Medal of Honor recipient for actions in the Korean War.
13. **Dante Alighieri** (May 1205 - September 13, 1321) Italian poet who wrote the Divine Comedy. Known as the "Father of the Italian language".
14. **Dick A. Greco** (September 14, 1935 -) A businessman, career politician, and civic activist from Tampa, Florida.
15. **Daniel Constantine Marino, Jr.** (September 15, 1961 -) Hall of Fame quarterback for the Miami Dolphins, 1983-1999.
16. **Corporal Joseph Vittori** (August 1, 1929 - September 16, 1951) U.S. Marine received Medal of Honor for actions during the Korean War.
17. **General Anthony C. Zinni** (September 17, 1943 -) U.S. Marine Corps retired four-star General and a former Commander in Chief of Central Command. Recipient of UNICO National's Grand Patriot Award in 2004.
18. **Rick Pitino** (September 18, 1952 -) Head basketball coach at the Universities of Louisville and Kentucky. The University of Kentucky won the NCAA championship in 1996 under his leadership.
19. **Margaret Scafati Roukema** (September 19, 1929 -) Congressional Representative from New Jersey.
20. **Sophia Loren** (September 20, 1934 -) Academy Award winning Italian film actress.
21. **Private Gary W. Martini** (September 21, 1948 - April 21, 1967) U.S. Marine received the Medal of Honor for action in the Vietnam War.
22. **Thomas Charles Lasorda** (September 22, 1927 -) Former Major League Baseball pitcher and manager - Brooklyn/Los Angeles Dodgers.
23. **Dino Paolo Restelli** (September 25, 1924 - August 8, 2006) Major League Baseball centerfielder for the Pittsburgh Pirates, in 1949 and 1951.
24. **Gerolamo Cardano** (September 24, 1501 - September 21, 1576) Mathematician, physician and astrologer; first to describe typhoid fever.
25. **Philip F. Rizzuto** (September 25, 1917 - August 13, 2007) NY Yankees Baseball shortstop, 1941-1956. Radio and TV announcer for 40 years.
26. **Ugo Cerletti** (September 26, 1877 - July 25, 1963) Neurologist who discovered the method of electroconvulsive therapy in psychiatry.
27. **Cosimo di Giovanni de' Medici** (September 27, 1389 - August 1, 1464) First of the Medici political dynasty - Italian Patron of the Arts.
28. **Michelangelo Merisi Caravaggio** (September 28, 1573 - July 18, 1610) Italian artist born in the Lombardy hill town of Caravaggio.
29. **Enrico Fermi** (September 9, 1901 - November 28, 1954) Italian physicist, noted for the development of the first nuclear reactor and the quantum theory. Recipient of the Nobel Prize in Physics in 1938.
30. **Monica Bellucci** (September 30, 1964 -) Italian actress and fashion model.
